What if the Law of **Attraction exists** in workspace management? If yes, can architecture augment or moderate it to success and efficiency of the team?

What if artificial light was banned? Would it change the quality of the workspace and how?

What if you could replace only one thing about the workspace through a digital tool? What would it be?

What if you could not make your own decisions regarding the development of your next office tower, but you had to choose someone else to make them for you? Who would you choose and why?

What if you had the chance to write a best-selling novel about a real estate services company? Would it be a romance, mystery, or factual historical account?

What if you could do one thing regarding the future of the office so well you could be famous? What would you do?

What if you had to teach your younger colleague in your real estate service company one thing? What would you teach today?

What if you had to choose between a comfortable and inspiring workspace in which you would work for only a few years or a boring, uncomfortable workspace for your entire career? Which would you choose and why?

What if the most important aim of the **built environment** is to create and enhance a sense of community? Where are the places of transformation, we start the change?

What if the purpose of architecture is to be generous, benefitting the owner, the end user, the precinct, the city at large as well as the broader environment?

What do you think the future city will look like? What radical changes do you think we will see in the next 50 years? Which will be the key drivers of economic growth and prosperity?
